Many of the children who end up in Homes like Bridge of Hope were either abandoned, total or partial orphans, or children facing abuse and/or were neglected. The maximum number of children recommended in a typical four-bedroom house in Kenya is 20. This is to ensure safe accommodation for children. Space expansion, basic living amenities, clothing, food/grocery supplies, and around-the-clock caregivers are some of the most vital necessities to operate a Home successfully. We hope to continue this partnership in the future in support of the life-changing efforts that Bridge of Hope continues to make for this community.
